QUICK SUMMARY:

Müller?...Müller?...Müller?...Müller?...For those old enough to get this riff off of a popular 1980's movie, thank you. It's the same font as the movie poster and we even gave a nod to the famous car scene as depicted above. Müller Thurgau was developed in Germany by a Swiss grape breeder named Hermann Müller in 1882. It was planted in most of those early 1970's vineyards here in the Willamette Valley, so when you find it, they are almost always old vines. These own rooted vines come from the Yamhill-Carlton AVA. The grapes were fermented on their skins for 11 days, then pressed off into neutral French oak barrels. The wine is unfinned (Vegan) and was lightly filtered.
